SICK, QUARANTINED, OR IN DIRECTED SELF-ISOLATION & HAVE BENEFITS THROUGH MY UNION

- Email benefit@bcrcc.ca or call 1-250-383-8116 ext. 2 to confirm you are currently covered on the BCRCC benefit plan. If so, you can apply for short-term disability (STD) through Pacific Blue Cross.
